On-site visits to places where persons may be deprived of their liberty






### The Committee's mandate

"No one shall be subjected to torture or to inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment".

1950 - Article 3 of the European Convention on Human Rights inspired the drafting of the *Convention establishing the CPT.* 

"By means of visits, the Committee examines the treatment of persons deprived of their liberty with a strengthening, where necessary, their protection against torture and inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment."


1989 - Ratification of the Convention establishing the CPT (article 1).





## "Structural problems" according to HUDOC-**CPT**

- 39 reports + 1 public statement
- 19 countries (or territories): Albania, Armenia, Belgium, BiH, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Russian Federation, Serbia, Kosovo\*, Türkiye, Ukraine, England/Wales, Scotland

### **Overcrowding**

#### Consequences

- Inappropriate living conditions
- Lack of privacy
- **Tensions**
- Reduced opportunities: work, acti, etc
- Insufficient staff

### **Overcrowding: CPT recommendations**

#### Develop coherence policies:

- Stop building new premises (except to replace dilapidated ones)
- Alternatives to detention
- Involve all the actors the criminal justice chain
- Limit the number of persons entering prisons

& review criminal legislations





### **Overcrowding: CPT recommendations**

The CPT once again calls upon the Cypriot authorities to adopt and implement a coherent strategy designed to concretely reduce the prison population. In particular, it reiterates its recommendation that pre-trial detention should only be used on an exceptional basis and that alternatives to detention should be concretely applied to a far greater extent. It wishes to be informed of the content of the concrete steps envisaged, and the timeframe, to implement this recommendation.

Prisons

Since 1991, the CPT has noted that prisons are overcrowded to worrying levels, with occupancy rates exceeding 200% in some establishments. This overcrowding in remand prisons is all the more striking as other establishments are under-used. At the time of the visit, almost 1,500 prisoners were sleeping on mattresses on the floor. In the three prisons visited (Bordeaux-Gradignan, Lille-Sequedin and Maubeuge), many prisoners were accommodated in two or three cells measuring less than 10 m². The CPT calls upon the French authorities to take urgent measures to ensure that each detainee has a bed and at least 4 m² of living space in a collective cell. A comprehensive strategy to reduce the prison population should be adopted, including measures to limit the number of incarcerations and to facilitate the adjustment of sentences. The Committee welcomes the drastic reduction in the prison population during the Covid-19 pandemic and asks the authorities to inform it of their intentions as to the sustainability of this situation.

### **Material conditions: CPT recommendations**

- Recall CPT standards & responsibility of the State
- Instruct immediate steps to remedy deficiencies
- New constructions = higher standards

& immediate observations (Art.8 §5)





## Informal prisoner hierarchy

#### Consequences on detained persons

- Interprisoner violence
- **Exploitation**
- Absence of reintegration

#### Consequences on the prison system

- Interference with the management
- Corruption
- Criminal activities in prison
- Use of drugs and prohibited items





## Informal hierarchy: CPT recommendations

- Review prison estate (cell-type accommodation)
- Prison staff (training, number, salary)
- Identify and sanction the leaders
- Protect vulnerable persons
- Prevent, detect and prosecute inter-prisoner violence



## **Solutions beyond reports**

Involve politicians / Ministers
